COVID Isolation and Quarantine Guidance

Updated January 4, 2022

The CDC revised their recommended isolation and quarantine guidance. The RASD Health & Safety Plan indicates we will follow the current guidelines. Please do not hesitate to contact the Nurse's Office if you have any questions.

IF	THEN
You test positive	 Isolate for 5 days from symptom onset. (if no symptoms, isolate from the date of positive result.) If on Day 6, You are asymptomatic, fever-free without mediation for at least 24 hours, and symptom-free, you may return and MUST wear a well-fitted mask for at least five days. If symptoms remain, you should continue to isolate.
You are identified as a close contact AND You are fully vaccinated*	 You do not need to be isolated but you MUST wear a well-fitted mask around others for ten (10) days. The CDC recommends you take a PCR test on Day 5. If you develop symptoms, get a test and stay home.
You are identified as a close contact AND You are unvaccinated or	 Quarantine for five (5) days from the date of exposure. Wear a well-fitted mask around others through the tenth (10) day. The CDC recommends you take a PCR test on Day 5. If you develop symptoms, get a test and stay home.
NOT fully vaccinated*	

*The CDC defines fully vaccinated as:

- Those individuals who have received a booster and two weeks have passed since the dose; or
- Those individuals who have completed the primary series of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine within the last six (6) months and therefore are not eligible for a booster.
- Those individuals who have completed the primary series of the J&J vaccine within the last two (2) months.
